Community Career Developer

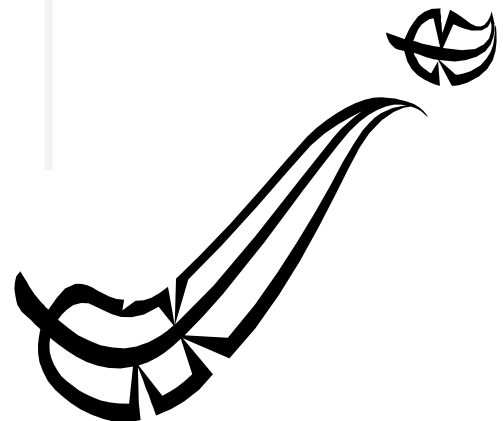

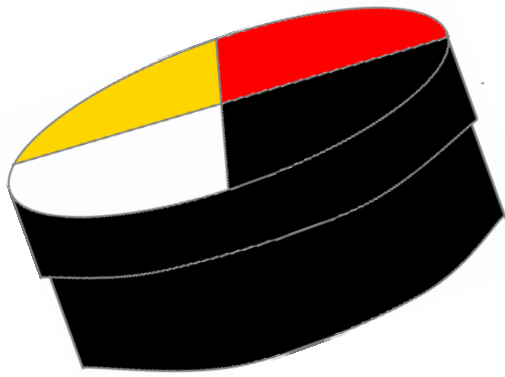


## Get Certified!
